The Session of OVPC met on Monday, May 14, 2018, in Fellowship Center.

Rev. Terry Dougherty, Moderator, opened with prayer and devotions at 7:08 P.M.

Orders of the Day:

We met with Ellen Neumann, Co-Moderator of the Sewing Circle. Ellen presented a report and highlighted the activities of the Sewing Circle. She presented the Mission Giving for 2017 and highlighted the newly supported local missions: La Esperanza, the Peoples Place and the Elizabeth Murphey School. Thanks to all who participate in the activities of the Sewing Circle.

MOTION passed to award 40% of the Pentecost Offering to MHDC (Milford Housing Development Corporation) for local projects.

The **Monthly Committee Reports** were received.

The Personnel Committee recognizes Marlene Quinn's resignation from the committee and thanks her for her extended service on this committee. Dale Smith will join the committee.

MOTION passed to approve Session Minutes of April 9, 2018 with a correction.

Pastor Terry is dedicated to Stephen Ministry as a new mission for OVPC and is funding this ministry through the First Call Leadership Program with Princeton Theological Seminary.

We received the New Castle Presbytery SPARK Ministry Grant for \$5,000.00 for new mission opportunities, to try something new and build

OVPC has received this notice from JOAN KING, Food Pantry Task Force, Community Lutheran Church, 302-732-1156:

Community Lutheran Church would like to partner with other churches in providing children with a bagged lunch containing two kid-friendly meals once or twice a week. After meeting with Jan Bomhardt, Clayton Elementary Guidance Counselor, we have settled on two local housing areas where the need appears to be the greatest. Our plan is to set a day and time that the lunches will be available and set up at the entrance to the park at that time (Pepper Ridge and Thorogood's Trailer Parks). Kids can walk or ride bikes there and pick up a lunch. We will prepare a flyer in English and Spanish that the school will distribute at the end of the school year to children living in the park(s).

CLC ran a similar program last summer, distributing about forty lunches a week. The lunch items were in white bakery bags that members of the congregation had decorated with drawings and friendly messages.

The program was known as White Bag Lunches and was very well received by kids and parents alike. Each bag cost about \$3.00 to put together. We hope to begin this ministry by mid- June.
