## ✧ Reflections ✧

A recent article in *USA Today* (Cathy Lynn Grossman, “More Americans tailoring religion to fit their needs,” [http://www.usatoday.com/NEWS/usaedition/2011-09-13-If-World-War-II-era-warbler-Kate\\_ST\\_U.htm](http://www.usatoday.com/NEWS/usaedition/2011-09-13-If-World-War-II-era-warbler-Kate_ST_U.htm)), reports on the research by George Barna (published in his book *Futurecast*). Barna has conducted annual surveys of 1,000 to 1,600 U.S. adults, between the years 1991 to 2011. While more people claim Jesus as their savior and expect to go to heaven, more also say they have not been to church in the past six months except for special occasions (for instance, weddings or funerals). Whereas in 1991, 24% were “unchurched,” today the figure is 37%. Barna commented, “People say, ‘I believe in God. I believe the Bible is a good book. And then I believe whatever I want.’” The author of the article stated, “The folks who make

up God as they go are side-by-side with self-proclaimed believers who claim the Christian label but shed their ties to traditional beliefs and practices.” Barna said that America is headed for “310 million people with 310 million religions.”

Sociologist Robert Bellah (co-author of *Habits of the Heart*, and now professor emeritus at University of California-Berkeley) commented on our culture’s individualism, “The bad news is you lose the capacity to make connections. Everyone is pretty much on their own.” And all this rampant individualism also fosters “hostility toward organized groups -- government, industry, even organized religion.”

While many causes can be found for this trend, the church must itself assume some responsibility. In the early period the church knew itself as a community of faith that stood apart from and that challenged the larger culture. However, when the state adopted Christianity, a bargain was struck in which the church tacitly agreed that emphasis would be put upon the individual’s faith. In other words, the church would stick to the personal realm, while the state took care of the public realm.

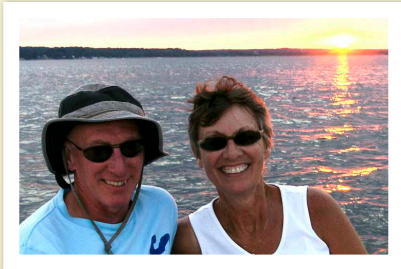
What we see today is both that the state is not living up to its part of the bargain and that we—who taught that faith is simply a matter between oneself and God—should not be surprised when people pursue their faith journey apart from the church community. Once a person knows that Jesus saves them, why bother with the church?

It is not a matter, however, of blame. We must learn what it means to be a community of faith. And we cannot take our cue from our society. We can only do this by immersing ourselves in Scripture. We need to see what Jesus expected of us. Jesus defeated the power of evil that is so visible in the world. Jesus called

into being a community of disciples who loved, cared, and forgave each other. Faith is not simply a matter between me and God. It is a matter in which Jesus draws us into his community. He calls us to relate with each other. He calls us to form a community that is different from the society around us and that challenges the idolatry, the violence, and the dehumanizing impact of that society. He calls us to be a mirror of the Kingdom of God. We must rediscover our identity as Jesus' people.

## Building and Grounds

OVPC, we have a **PROBLEM.** Most of you probably know that yard waste made up of biodegradable material must not be mixed with garbage/trash or with recyclables. The State of Delaware is mandating that yard waste is not to be placed in any designated land fill. In past weeks the trash pickup contractors have left notes to that effect. They will be fined if the waste stations or collection/transfer stations fine any yard waste in what they dump. This includes the stuff in dark plastic bags. The drivers are being very careful so they know what is in the trash in order to avoid fines. Those fines will come right back to the church and could endanger our contract.

Similarly, we must be careful of what is put in the Recycle Bin. B&G is trying to get a definitive list from the contractor. Delaware Solid Waste Authority (DSWA) has told us that each contractor may have a different list of what they call recyclable. Naturally this list is based on what they call sell and what is best for their bottom line. Until we hear from the

contractor we will abide by the original list from DSWA.

Okay, problem is solved, right? We will abide by the law and be good stewards of the planet earth.

For those of you that do not use the rest rooms in the Fellowship Center, the ceilings have become discolored by water leaks and just plain dirt that was difficult to clean. The men's group, under Herb's guidance, replaced the ceiling panels with wall board. This will be painted in about a week.

The advertisement for a weed killer has been answered. Bill Colwill is now in charge of weed de-ratification. Thanks Bill, for taking on this job.

Last but not least, the B&G co-chairs are calling a committee meeting. The meeting will be in Memorial Hall at 7 PM on Thursday October 6, 2011. The objective is to review the necessary fall clean up and to list other work that needs to be accomplished prior to the Meeting of Presbytery on November 15.

### **RECYCLABLES LIST**

**Paper** - junk mail (just about any paper), cardboard & paperboard, corrugated cardboard boxes of all sizes (boxes should be flattened), cereal boxes, Kleenex type boxes and any box of similar material, paper towel; toilet paper rollers and similar material. *Paper cups should be rinsed.*

**Glass and Plastic** - Yogurt & butter containers and similar containers and plastic bags. **NO** lids and **NO** other type of glass. Only other plastics marked with a recycle triangle 1 or 2.

**Aluminum and Steel Cans** (rinsed) - food, beverage, pet food cans (rinsed) and empty aerosol cans. **PLEASE** no foil, pie pans, paint cans aluminum or metal plates or trays.

**NONO's** - No styrofoam of any kind, motor oil containers, containers that have had harmful contents or if the container label states **DO NOT RECYCLE**, CFLs, batteries, window glass, mirrors, metal (except as noted above).

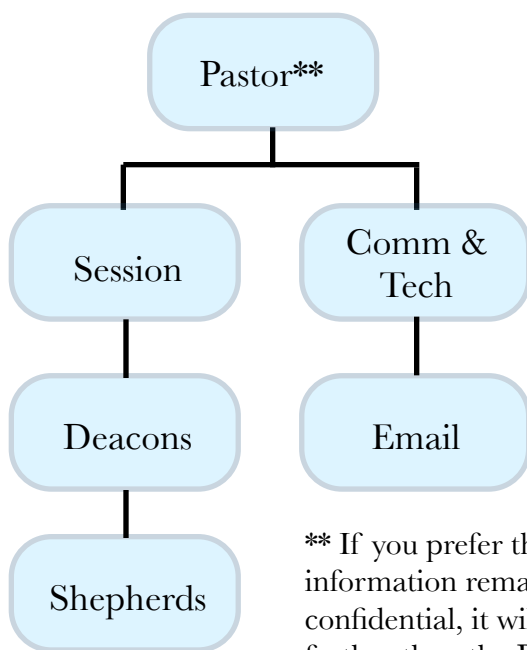

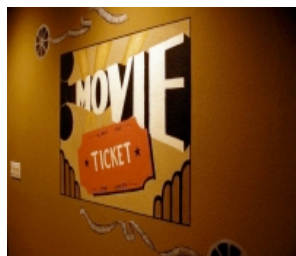
