God, our Sovereign, how majestic is your Name! We behold your heavens, moon and stars: who are we that you care for us? Yet you crown us with glory and honor, make us responsible for the works you have made, sheep, oxen, birds, fish! How majestic is your name in all the earth! Allow us to learn to live with one another, together with creation; make peace a reality! Give us strength, faith and hope, to the day when justice and peace meet with a kiss! Then how we shall sing and praise!

Holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are filled with your glory! Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest; hosanna in the highest.

God, lover of the unlovable, we thank you that at the right time you sent Jesus to live and be with us. He lived as a child, in a society where children are not recognized. God, Founder and Giver of life, come and transform this bread and wine, made by workers, to be holy food for your people. As we eat and drink, renew our hearts, minds and souls, that we may be one with Christ and one another. Nourish us, to grow into the likeness of Christ, our Redeemer. Amen.
