Alright, alright, just a wee bit o' craic (fun) as ghaelige (in Irish): Happy New Year! This is our third New Year's Eve and Day here, though only the second on which I get to send you this note, and we are happier each successive one, here in the embrace of OVPC. Knowing you better and better has meant loving you better and better; may this continue ever and ever, le cunamh De

(God willing). It feels a bit like this, from the Sisters of Saint Martha of Antigonish website:

A new year stands on my doorstep/ ready to enter my life's journey.

Something in me welcomes this visitor: the hope of bountiful blessings, the joy of a new beginning, the freshness of unclaimed surprises.

Something in me rebuffs this visitor: the swiftness of the coming, the boldness of the entrance, the challenge of a year's goodbye.

Something in me fears this visitor: the unnamed events of future days, the wisdom needed to walk love well, the demands of giving away and growing.

A new year stands on my doorstep. With fragile caution I move to open the door for its entrance; my heart leaps with surprise, joy jumps in my eyes, for there beside this brand new year stands my God with outstretched hand!

God smiles and gently asks of me: can we walk this year together?

And I, so overwhelmed with goodness, can barely whisper my reply: "Welcome in!"

When I was a child in the Split Rock development, in Hazlet, NJ, my friends and I would wake up ridiculously early on New Year's day and, regardless of weather, race around the neighborhood naming ourselves to be the "first" to accomplish (increasingly petty and ridiculous) feats in the new year. First to climb the Mahers' hill. First into "the woods" or "the reeds". First to knock over the Gerrity's garbage cans...

As we get older, and more full of first experiences than we might really like, we become more cautious; and we become more jaded. *Nihil Novi sub Sole* (nothing new under the sun) becomes our watchword. Youthful carryings-on like the above seem beneath us. But... but our Lord promises us newness of life; as we spent Advent discussing, that includes surprise,

and novelty, and the overturning of expectations (if NOT trashcans!).

To be a Christian is, above all, to be a person of welcome. Welcome to the stranger, welcome to the Word of God in and for our lives, welcome to the task of change – whether or not it is pleasant! The new year is a great time to stretch our daily examen into a life-review, a questioning of our practices and disciplines, a penetrating look at how another, how God, just might see the state of our life. Yes, of course, there is mercy and forgiveness, thanks be to God! But God wants more, and sees more, for us than our narrowness and habit can ever see without stretching, and without a bit of discomfort. The person God always meant us to be, and always means us to be, is set above angels. The one we settle for being is frequently less than angelic.

Let us, in 2020, embrace the idea that, whoever and wherever on this road we are, we are still only *becoming*. Let's welcome the stress and surprise of our own growth, safe in the knowledge of God's blessing and protection. Will you pray with me?

Come, Holy Spirit, Spirit of God, Spirit of the Risen Christ, be with us today and always. Be our Light, our Guide, and our Comforter. Be our Strength, our Courage, and our Sanctifier. May this new year be a time of deep spiritual growth for us, a time for welcoming your graces and your gifts, a time for forgiving freely and unconditionally, a time for growing in virtue and goodness. Come, Holy Spirit, be with us today and always. Amen.

This day is a new day that has never been before.

This year is a new year, the opening door. [open the door...]

SESSION REPORT

The Session of OVPC met on Monday, December 9, 2019, in Fellowship Center.

Rev. Terry Dougherty, Moderator, opened with prayer and devotions at 6:00 PM.

Orders of the Day:

Facilities Committee Chair, Judy Reich presented the new Facility Coordinator's Manual.

Welcome Group/New Sign – Update by Bill Colwill. **MOTION** to approve the letter to be mailed to OVPC members and friends detailing the project and the funding required to make the sign a reality. The group will present the 'OVPC sign' and answer your questions during Christian Education hour on January 5, 2020.

The Pastor Support Team (PST) updated Session on their activities and accomplishments for the second year of the Princeton First Call Pastoral Leadership Program. The PST members: Rev. Dr. Tom Kort (Princeton Theological Seminary), Pam Price, Mike Read, Kathy Sheetz and Karen Colwill, performed an independent review of Pastor Dougherty in accordance with the program. Pastor Dougherty is to be applauded for his second year! We will be focused this year on improving Pastor Dougherty's administrative skills. The PST is distributing 80% of the Pastoral Personal Grant monies to Pastor Dougherty. The remaining Pastoral Discretionary Fund monies will remain in the account to be utilized during 2020.

Bob Wolf, Chair of the **Communications/Technology Committee** reviewed their accomplishments of 2019 and their plans for 2020. **MOTION** approved to lease a new copier, with folder and booklet capabilities, effective January 2020. The impact to the 2020 budget is \$82 per month. Session thanks the Communications/Technology Committee for their dedication to OVPC and commitment to keeping our technology up-to-date and operational.

MOTION approved to accept Pastor Dougherty's **Terms of Call** to be placed before the congregation at the Annual Meeting on February 2, 2020 for approval.

Finance Committee presented the first detailed review of the 2020 budget. The Finance Committee will review the modified budget and present a final 2020 Budget for approval at the January Session Meeting.

MOTION passed to approve the minutes of the November 3, 2019 Session Meeting.

MOTION passed to approve the **October 2019 Finance Reports**.

MOTION passed to approve the **November 2019 Finance Reports**.

Pastor Terry's report was received. **MOTION** passed to approve Pastor Terry's request for vacation Thursday, December 26, 2019 and Thursday, January 2, 2020.




