2021 felt, for me and I'm sure for you, like a mighty long way, a wilderness way, an endless series of burdens, obstacles and stumbling blocks. The pandemic, political strife, climate change accompanied by horrific storms and droughts and temperature extremes and wildfires and earthquakes and... well, we could go on. As we read apocalypses last month, through Advent, it could feel as though we were also living them. And, if I'm honest, there were times it could just dry up the spirit in me.

But you know what? I had you to turn to; you to be with Sunday to Sunday; you on the phone and the email and in the office and in my prayers – as I know I was in yours. You brought joy in bad days, you created good days, you showed the best in the midst of the worst. Strength to believe the work is not in vain was only as far away as any one of you.

My greatest confidence, though, reflects the greatest strength of this church: I knew with not a gram of doubt that you were doing the same, continually, for each other. I knew no-one needed

I feel all that came together, in the most quietly lovely way, in the return of the live Nativity Festival. Not only was it beautiful, but in a quiet way the festival evinced strength, and hope for tomorrow, and the promise of a future. It was so true, and so healing. We are so very blessed...

And so again, happy new year! May the best of the year behind us live on in our hearts! It showed us a lot about those hearts, a lot for us to, like Mary, ponder in our hearts. Last year showed us that a heart of stone can indeed be changed, by our God, into a heart of flesh. All we had to do was be present to it, present to each other, and present to God, who was of course always present to us, working all things to our good, because we love God. I'll close with another hymn, this one by Albert A. Goodson:

Every year we say 'this is the best one yet' but this year in particular, your writings, photographs, and prayers have truly inspired my personal meditation and prayer time. I recently read a quote from Sister Ilia Delio who said "I think Advent is a coming to a new consciousness of God, you know, already loving us into something new, into something more whole, that we're not in a sense waiting for what's not there; we're in a sense to be attending to what's already there."; and I believe that the sharing of your thoughts, experiences, memories and faith allowed me to experience this wondrous season just a little bit differently and allowed me to become even closer to my God.

Dear companions in mission,

I began this season with every intention of keeping Advent. I had my Advent calendar, prepared by a friend from seminary, with a Bible passage for each day. I tried to start each day with a space for reflection. Soon I

realized that in the midst of writing year-end reports and grading papers for our courses at the Latin American Biblical University (UBL), I had turned keeping Advent into yet another task.

Advent requires a different logic. I do not want to keep Advent; I want to be captured by and held by expectant hope. This is not a hope I can create. I can only open myself and allow it to flow in and through me.

Advent is about making room. Just before Advent began, we learned that a friend in Nicaragua was being threatened by the police and parapolice groups. Miguel is a theologian connected with the Interchurch Center for Theological and Social Studies (CIEETS), the institution where I worked in Nicaragua (1988-1994). Rather than join the more than 100 political prisoners being held by the Ortega-Murillo regime, Miguel chose exile as thousands of others have done. After a few days in a safe house, he made contact with those who spirited him across the border. Once he was in Costa Rica territory, Miguel registered for an appointment to claim refugee status. Then he made his way to San Jose, where we received him in our home. Here there is room and safety. Miguel was also able to get a Covid vaccination once he was here. Back in Nicaragua, there is a four-year-old autistic boy named Lucas who does not understand why his father is not there. Lucas and his mother, Gabriela, are currently living with Gabriela's mother. Miguel and Gabriela ask for your prayers that their family might be together soon.

As Advent comes to a close, I want to thank you for making room in your lives to accompany me, my students and my colleagues with your prayers and support. Because of you, Javier and I are here to offer room to Miguel. Because of you, I have been able to keep teaching throughout the pandemic, encouraging women and men throughout Latin America as they serve their communities and share messages of hope.

Thus, Jesus' birth finds us this year, longing to see changes. We join our own songs to that of Mary, who dreamed of the powerful being thrown from their thrones and the hungry being filled with good things (Luke 1: 52-53). God keeps coming to us in the midst of the many ways human beings have constructed to oppress one another. The Babe in the manger says to us another way of life is possible. May we encounter one another in the stable in Bethlehem and there find the renew strength to dream together with God of a world transformed.

In the month of December 2021 the following was accomplished:

- The Nativity scene was set up in front of the Sanctuary, to include a spot light timed to go on with the security lights at dusk.
- On December 11 (second Saturday Work Day) the cleanup of leaves along the parking lot side of the Office and MH that had been planned to be done prior to the Nativity Festival was completed. The leaves were raked into tarps and carried around to the rear of the Memorial Hall and placed around the 8 crape myrtles to serve as mulch. The sidewalks were blown clean with a leaf blower just in time for the arrival of the first guests to the festival.
- The wire flower stands for Christmas were moved from the garage to Memorial Hall.
- The hose bibs outside the Fellowship Center and Memorial Hall were winterized

Future:

On January 8, 2022 and continuing through all of 2022, the Work Day has being changed to the 2nd Saturday of the month so that the plans for the Work Day can be included in the Newsletter just prior to the Work Day rather than after.

One day a month, with 4 or 5 volunteers, is not enough to accomplish all that needs to be done.

Over the past two years one day a week is closer to what is needed. If a Saturday is not a good day for you, and another day or additional day would work better, we would be willing to meet you any day of the week from 9 AM until noon.

During the winter months of January, February and March all of the trees, shrubs and bushes need to be trimmed back before they begin to bud in March this includes:

Crepe Myrtles:

- Corner of Church Ave & West Ave
- Behind Memorial Hall
- Corner in front of the new sign at the corner of Central Ave and the adjacent parking lot
- Along the fence between the Cemetery and the adjacent parking lot

Rose bushes:

- Along parking lot side of the Sanctuary (5)
- Next to the rear entrance to the Fellowship Center (2)

Grass shrubs along West Ave and Garage need to be cut to the ground..(7)

Yew bushes in front of the windows next to the front porch of the Sanctuary need to be pruned (5) Church Office:

• Ornamental Grass along sidewalk to office door (cut to ground)

Weeding:

- Area behind HP ramp to Sanctuary main entrance
- Historic sign in front of Sanctuary
- Flag pole
- Planting area along Fellowship Center
- Area around well
- Corner of Church Ave & West Ave
- Breezeway between Sanctuary and Fellowship Center

- ☑ Buy with credit cards. Credit cards offer the most protection. Never use peer-to-peer apps to pay an online vendor.
- ☑ Read the fine print. They call it fine print because they don't want you to read it. Zoom in on your smartphone or computer screen to make sure you understand all terms and conditions.
- ☑ Be extra cautious when making a purchase via social media. Scammers are using platforms like Facebook and Instagram more than ever.
- ☑ Double-check the URL to ensure you are on the intended site when making a purchase.


